Summary

I am currently employed as a Senior Lecturer in English Language at Middlesex University. I have teaching interests in a broad range of language and linguistics-related topics. My main research interests are all linked to the study of linguistic meaning (linguistic semantics and pragmatics). I have a particular interest in how meanings are created and negotiated in specific contexts, and am currently working on research in three areas: intonational meaning, stylistics and the inferential processes involved in writing. I am a member of the Middlesex University Applied Language Studies Research Group. I have a strong interest in pedagogy, including in developing links between work in schools and in higher education. I am a member of several committees with pedagogical and educational interests including a Subject Centre Special Interest Group working towards the development of an A Level in Linguistics. I have given presentations to A level students and, with Graeme Trousdale (Edinburgh), have been running a 5-day residential course on linguistics at Villiers Park Educational Trust for the Young Gifted and Talented Programme every year since 2007. I have contributed articles to 'emagazine', a publication aimed at A level students of English Language, English Literature and English Language & Literature. I have contributed several entries to encyclopedias and was section editor for the 'Foundations of Linguistics' section of the Elsevier Encyclopedia of Language and Linguistics, edited by Keith Brown. I am currently working on a book on Relevance Theory for Cambridge University Press which will appear in their 'Cambridge Textbooks in Linguistics' series. I was a member of the QAA benchmarking panel for linguistics. I am Director of The Lecture List (a lecture listings service initially funded by NESTA, the National Endowment for Science, Technology and the Arts) and have worked as a freelance writer working in a number of old and new media.
